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Treasurer's Report

We continue, as an organization, to be in an enviable financial position with a total working capital position in excess of \$500,000.00. This includes the Memorial Building fund which now stands at nearly \$300,000.00. Donations to this fund exceeded \$3,500.00 for the first six months of the fiscal year. In addition we were recently advised that the Southern Alberta Pioneers had been named as a beneficiary in the will of Evelyn Hardwick Calow, in the amount of \$50,000.00.

The rental operations continue to contribute, in a large way, to our financial well-being. Rental income to March 31st exceeded last year by nearly \$6,000.00 and advance bookings for the balance of the year are very encouraging. As well, two building projects, window replacements in the kitchen and office, and the new lift qualify for a grant from the City of Calgary. An application has been made and we are hopeful that this application will be approved and provide us with \$11,500.00.

In my last report I noted that the Board was concerned with the continuing losses realized on many of our social events. The Board considered a number of suggestions to mitigate these losses, including increasing the prices charged for the events. It was decided to leave prices as is and to continue to monitor the situation. Since those discussions, there has been a marked improvement with losses considerably reduced in most events held this year.

As reported separately by the Building Committee, there are numerous repair and improvement projects underway or in the planning stage. These will be financed through the use of a combination of existing reserves, government grants and operating surpluses. As always no projects will be undertaken without the funding in place.

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2011 Stampede Display

Planning for the SAPD display at the 2011 Calgary Stampede is well underway.

We have received confirmation that our booth is going to be re-located into the Western Showcase (western art exhibit) area of the BMO Centre. As a part of the new arrangements, the Western Showcase Committee and the Stampede have made some funds available in 2011 to integrate our display into the overall design and motif of the Western Showcase and have given some assurances respecting complimentary display space for the space and volunteer day passes beyond 2011.

Western Showcase has provided us with a proposed layout and design of the booth. We are in the process of confirming the specifics including the display capacity of the newly constructed booth

and associated display panels being provided by Western Showcase.

SAPD has purchased approximately 20 new images from the Glenbow to augment our archives and to incorporate into the 2011 display. While we have not yet landed on which photos from SAPD's inventory of 600+ photos will be displayed, we will again be featuring the main street and surrounding environs of southern Alberta towns in the late 1800s/early 1900s, a theme that was very popular with last year's display. We will be improving the legend/map so that it will be easier to locate photos on the various panels.

As in the past, we will have a vehicle from the Remington Carriage Museum on display. We have confirmed the Western Passenger Wagon (or stagecoach) which has been very popular in previous years.

SAPD will again be collaborating with the Calgary Stampede's Historical Committee in the display. The CS Historical Committee will feature historical photos celebrating the 50th anniversary of the CS Stampede Ranch. Importantly, the CS Historical Committee will again provide some volunteers to staff the display.

Our biggest challenge remains to broaden the group of SAPD volunteers to staff the booth for each of the 12 days, including the Showcase Stir'Up, the private opening of the Western Showcase art show on July 6th and Sneak a Peek on July 7th.
