Building Report

2015 saw some interesting rewards and challenges for the Building committee. The highlight of the year was the July installation of the beautiful new wood doors on the main entrance to the Memorial Building. We congratulate Fran Copithorne for her foresight persistence and perseverance in making this project come to fruition. Undoubtedly these stunning doors will be part of the Memorial building for generations to come. The Joe Ferguson memorial bench was also installed in July, the purchase and installation was made possible by a generous donation from a long time family friend Abe Epp of Artison Homes. Abe also donated the resources to install the bronze nameplates that Peggy Barr ordered on the rest of the memorial benches.

The challenges moving forward are managing the high cost of landscaping and snow removal; these costs represent a substantial percentage of our annual operating expenses. General building maintenance costs are also on the rise and supporting rental revenues are down as a result of procedural changes and event operating hours.

We are in the process of obtaining quotes for snow removal, cleaning and polishing the interior logs & fixtures, replacement of exterior Christmas lights and tech plumbing costs to assess repairs if any required for the sewer lines. By the time the newsletter is published we will have had insurance adjuster at the property to ascertain if there was any hail damage to the property.






Rotary House Tea

Calgary Stampede Display - 2015

Once again this year's display was a great success. This was the 5th year being in the Western Oasis, the 100,000 square foot space in Halls D & E of the BMO Centre which is totally dedicated to exhibits of Western art and lifestyles. While the booth is tucked in the back of the Western Oasis it does attract the traffic that is genuinely interested in Southern Alberta history.

Our 6th year collaborating with the Calgary Stampede Historical Committee also worked extremely well and greatly assisted with staffing the display.

As in previous years, SAPD's photo display consisted of 300 + photos from the SAPD collection. This year we featured the story of the North West Mounted Police trek westward to quell the whiskey trade to the Indians and establish law and order in the West. 8 X 10 photos as well as larger images and maps covered the N.W.M.P. (and later the R.N.W.M.P.) from the years 1874 to 1930's.

The Calgary Stampede Historical Committee featured the many past Indian Princesses as well as the 40th birthday of Harry the Horse.

We have had the stagecoach (more properly called the Western Passenger Wagon) compliments of the Remington Carriage Museum in our booth for many years and it, amazingly enough, continues to be a draw to those visitors wanting a photo memory of the Calgary Stampede. We will have to evaluate the possible use of this unit in the next years display but it is hard to argue with success.

Some 200 + people signed the guest book, including visitors from across Canada, outside of Canada including several states in the U.S. and several International points such as Australia, UK, Africa and China to name a few. The Chinese comment was written in Chinese which I had translated by my next door neighbor and, yes, it was a very positive comment about the history we portrayed.

We received considerable "soft" financial support from the Calgary Stampede Western Showcase Committee in the form of booth construction and take down, display space and day passes for volunteers - a big thank you to Cheyne Parkinson and her committee for their continued support. A big thank you as well to Joan Hampaul for time spent assembling the volunteer roster and preparing and sending letters and passes to volunteers. Susan Priel and husband John Hails continues to be invaluable to our display formation by handling the Mac computer to generate the photos and researching the text to attach to each photo. Also thanks go to Jim McDonald and Bud Vine who continue to work behind the scenes researching photos and text for photos. Assistance from the Stampede Historical Committee chair Linda Clarkson and her committee members are greatly appreciated.

I have not included the names of all SAPD and CSHC volunteers in this year's summary of the 2015 display in an effort to save space and postage. This does not diminish, in any way, the appreciation we have for all the volunteers who give of their time to support our display at the

Calgary Stampede year after year. Thank You One And All!

Just to let you know there are 135 spaces to fill in the booth for the eleven days (including Sneak-a-Peek). This year 79 Southern Alberta Pioneer volunteers and 28 Calgary Stampede Historical Committee volunteers manned the booth. Several, as you can see, helped with two or more shifts.
