Memorial Building Committee Report

s mentioned in the last newsletter, consultants to the City of Calgary (who we lease our building from) conducted a Building Condition Assessment (BCA) that assesses the physical condition of our building and property.

From this BCA, a "Life Cycle Report" was issued that identified 106 items that require action over the next 25 years, including 23 items that require attention in the next five years. Most of these items are minor and can be accomplished with minimal costs. The BCA process is done every five years.


The Building Committee has identified the following major items that are eligible for government funding and will require professional contractors to execute.

- Refinish the south entry door exterior wood slab surfaces
- Investigate the condition of the timber log walls and devise a scope of work to restore the condition of the walls

- Repair and refinish the timber log walls on the building perimeter based on findings and recommendations
- Replace gutters and downspouts
- Replace spalled/missing stones and re-point cracked mortar joints on the flagpole stone base, and the stone pillars at the site east entry gate
- Repair stone mortar on the chimney structure on the building's west elevation



- Refinish hardwood flooring surfaces located in the southwest basement storage room
- Replace windows on the original building north, south and east elevations
- Seal longitudinal cracks in the parking lot asphalt pavement



With the help from our Project Manager, Jason Moroz from Three Peaks Group, the City of Calgary has issued formal letters granting "Project Support in Principle." This is the first step towards formal approval, and it also confirms that we are eligible for funding of up to 75% of the costs to a maximum of \$300,000, which will come from the Capital Conservation Grant (CGC). In addition, the City will support our application for further funding under the Provincial Community Facility Enhancement Program (CFEP).

The next steps toward formal approval are providing Scope of Works and contactor quotes, technical reviews, and financial reviews.

We have engaged a contractor who specializes in heritage building renovations to provide a Scoping document along with estimates for these projects (except the parking lot repairs). Since the building is designated as a Municipal Heritage Site, we must get approval from the City's Heritage Planning Department before final approval is granted from the City.

Along with these major projects, there are several other minor projects that we would like to get done this year such as:

- Installing Community Little Library Box
- Installing a guard rail at the top of the stairs
- Painting various areas of the building
- Restoring benches



Our annual Spring cleanup day that was scheduled for April 18 could not be held due to inclement weather. There is not a lot of work required this year due to the building being sparsely utilized due to COVID restrictions. However, we want to keep the building and the grounds looking pristine. Further announcements will be made about a cleanup day, although the number of people required will be limited.

As always, we are greatly appreciative of volunteers stepping forward to either donate their time or money to complete the never-ending tasks that need to be done to keep our beautiful facility in fine form for our members, renters and the many dog walkers who pass by each day.

In fact, one Parkhill neighbour was so enamoured by our gardens that she provided a generous donation towards purchasing items for them.
