Stampede Exhibit 2004

The Southern Alberta Pioneers and Their Descendants hosted another very successful exhibit in the Roundup Centre again this year thanks to the many volunteers. It would not have been possible without the coooperation we received. Of the 88 time slots manned during the 10 days, 79 were filled by our membership (some volunteers were there 2 or 3 times), seven by the Lougheed House volunteers and two by the Chinook Country Historical Society.

We, as in previous years, had the support of the Remington Carriage Museum in Cardston. They provided two units for the booth. Also, for the first time this year, Reynolds-Alberta Museum in Wetaskiwin supplied two vehicles. Thanks to Remington and Reynolds for trucking the units to and from Calgary free of charge.

Thanks also to the Stampede Board for providing an excellent booth space this year. It certainly allowed us to be "front and centre" and we attracted many, many visitors because of it.

A major part of our exhibit this year was the 140-picture display. A big thank you goes out to Bud Vine for his expertise in copying the pictures and for providing us with some of his own. The following article about my uncle was published in 1933 by the **Calgary Daily Herald**, Saturday Nov. 18, for the Jubilee Edition. Superintendent Macdonell was a member of the Macdonnell Clan and was married to Marguerite de Billefeuille of Montreal. There have been three generations of Macdonnells who have served with the North West Mounted Police and the Royal Canadian Mounted Police. The spelling of the name is not correct in the article.

<u>Family History</u> Arrived When Calgary was a Stockaded Fort, July 1882

One of the real veterans of the West and distinguished member of the original "Mounties" is Major A.E.C. McDonell, former superintendent of the Royal North West Mounted Police now residing in Calgary at 1803 Eighteenth Street Southwest. Major McDonell arrived in Calgary in July, 1882, with "E" Troop of the N.W.M.P and remained until July, 1887. Of his experiences the Major says:

"At that time the N.W.M.P.post was a stockaded fort, regimental guard was mounted every day at 2 o'clock and a seven pounder gun fired every day at 12 o'clock. At the time of my arrival, the Hudson's Bay post was situated just east of the Elbow; Mr. Fraser was in charge and the I.G. Baker Company's store was in a log building just west of the Elbow with Johnny Dunn in charge.

"I joined the Force in Montreal; Col. W.M.Herchmer at the time superintendent, was recruiting for the Force. We left Ottawa on the 7th of May and sailed for Collinwood to Duluth, from there to Bismark on the Northern Pacific, from there to Cut Bank on the Missouri from which point we marched to Fort Walsh, which was then the headquarters of the police.

"I did service during the construction of the C.P.R. through the mountains and was in charge of the detachment at Revelstoke, when the Riel Rebellion broke out in 1885. Inspector Sam B. Steel was in command of the policing during the contruction of the C.P.R. and was ordered with his party to report to Calgary.

"On arrival in Calgary, Inspector Steele was posted with his command to the Alberta Field Force under the command of Major General Strange. As Steele's scouts. We marched out of Calgary on the 19th of April, 1885 headed by the fife and drum of the 91st Battalion . We came in contact with the Indians of Big Bear's Band at Fort Pitt and were in the engagement at Frenchman's Butte at Loon Lake.

"I did duty in the Yukon for ten years and was the first superintendent of the Alberta Provincial Police. Assigned as police magistrate for 14



years in Peace River and district, having resigned from the R.C.M. Police in 1917.

Building Committee Report

What a pleasure it is to report to our membership that our parking lot is now paved. Concrete curbs poured at the north and south ends, bumper curbs re-installed, and the parking lines painted on the new asphalt. This has only taken your committee four years of constant pressure on the City to install a proper storm drain system for our parking lot to drain in to.

The log restoration work on the exterior of the building is now complete with all the badly decayed log ends replaced with new logs.

New security bars have been installed on four more windows, and the balance are being built and will be installed within the next couple of weeks.

The new roof is now complete with an insulation factor of R21; all that remains to be done is to have the new eavestroughing installed.

The concrete work for the new storage building, the present building, and the garbage container has been poured. The new storage building will be in place before winter.

On August 23rd the committee met with Geoff and Melanie regarding the custodian contract on the building and grounds. They have agreed to work for the same rates and conditions as last year, for the period October 1, 2004 to September 30, 2005.

The Family Papers Collection A Once in a Lifetime Opportunity

We have been cautioned to beware of offers that are too good to be true. However, when an offer comes from the prestigious National Genealogical Society in collaboration with the Calgary-based Alberta Family Histories Society (AFHS) you may want to take note.

The NGS has kindly consented to help make October the Family History Month in Southern Alberta.

NGS will send a mobile team of technical workers to Calgary for an unprecedented event. The team will come prepared to record treasured family documents, records and artifacts for all who are interested in preserving the history of their family.

The NGS Family Papers Collection has been established in an effort to preserve unique family records that are being lost or destroyed at an alarming rate.

The recording team will arrive in Calgary on October 4th and will spend

several weeks digitizing any documents of genealogical significance that are made available by local participants.

All those who are interested in compiling their family history are invited to present their holdings for digital recording on a CD at NO COST to them. The documents will remain the property of the participant. NGS will only ask for approval to catalogue and display the digital images on a public website. Participants are encouraged to observe or even assist in the digitizing process. In addition to obtaining digitized versions of these priceless and perhaps irreplaceable documents the participants will have the satisfaction of knowing that the digital copy of them is being made available so that researchers worldwide may be able to access and use.

The AFHS Library at 712 - 16th Avenue NW in Calgary will be established as headquarters for the project.

The technical team from NGS will

provide several presentations publicizing their work. The first will be offered at a meeting of the AFHS on October 4th. Another will be made at the AFHS FAMILYROOTS 2004 Expo/Seminar on Saturday, October 16th at the Carriage House Inn, Calgary.
